FACTS

Hamilton County is one of 18 Ohio counties, funded by USDA National Institute of Food and Agriculture, to provide community nutrition education through the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP).

The National Endowment for Financial Education's High School Financial Planning Program reached students in more than 100 Ohio schools, due in part to support and promotion from OSU Extension. Over 8,000 student guides were shipped at teacher requests, equipping students to be financially stable and successful as young adults.

Extension personnel provided educational material to homeowners on the impacts of plant pests and diseases (Asian Long Horned Beetle, Emerald Ash Borer, and Thousand Canker Disease) on long term storm water management.

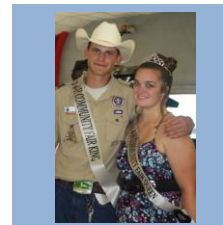

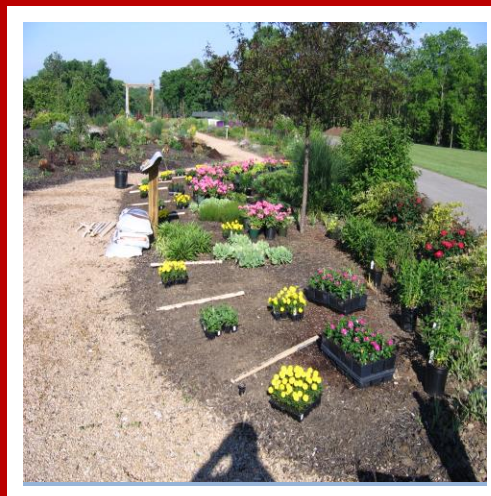

Highlights from 2013

- The OSU Extension, Hamilton County office relocated in April to an office in Mt. Airy Forest. This move has stemmed a new partnership with the Cincinnati Park District and joint programs are being planned for 2014.
- New knowledge gained at the Tri-State Green Industry Conference will save participants over \$894,936.
- 183 youth experienced friendly competition, success in completing projects, and a better knowledge of 21st Century Workforce Skills.
- A total of 262 adults and 1355 youth were reached by our Expanded Food and Nutrition Education program. This program helps parents and children make smarter food decisions, thus helping lower the obesity rate in Hamilton County.
